FROM THE DIRECTOR'S DESK

The hallmark of education at Lady Irwin College is experiential learning, innovative approaches, industrial placements and internships which enrich teaching at both UG and PG levels. Experiential learning in schools, hospitals and NGOs is also an



integral part of the curriculum. Students are taught sustainable technologies with lead examples. The college also set up solar panels in October 2020 to set an example. The year 2020-2021 was unprecedented and challenging due to COVID-19. In March 2020, online teaching for theory and practicals, seminars, online internships, online research data collection gave a new perspective to our college students with regard to the teaching-learning processes. International faculty, researchers and NGOs were invited for student enrichment. The Food Technology students were encouraged to do science based projects under DBT-Star Scheme. The college continued to work on Women Collectives in various parts of the country even during pandemic under ROSHNI projects of MoRD. The college also served as nodal hub for ODOP-One District One Product for State of Delhi, for Delhi Government.

The interdisciplinary subjects continued to provide strength and capacity. The students take electives of Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Zoology, Sociology, Psychology, English and elective Home science papers. They also have a choice of skill -based options to hone skill-sets that can ensure setting up of start-ups, digital enhancement and job market requirements. This is in sync with national policies in particular and national priorities at large. Large array of co-curricular activities enhance leadership, self-expression and organizational skills which contributes to their personality and has long term implications. Our philosophy of education emphasizes reaching out to even more marginalized groups for example skill development of drug addicted youth, mental health concerns, malnutrition etc. Our focus on research and extension is incomparable. The college was rated at A+ by NAAC in 2018 and held All India Rank among colleges at 24 by NIRF in 2021.

The College is committed to sustainable development and addresses most of the Sustainable Development Goals in small and large endeavours. Its engagement with issues of food security, prevention of malnutrition, education, solid waste & e-waste management, rural-peri-urban-urban dwellings, water ATMS, water and air quality management, human development, initiatives for disability, skill and artisans capacity building are very evident. Activities from our college are lauded from various quarters. The college has received several recognitions, awards on innovation and teaching practices.

The Background

The year 2021 marks the completion of 89 years of establishment of the Lady Irwin College. Lady Irwin College, the first Home Science college of India. The college was established in 1932 under the patronage of the then Vicereine, Lady Dorothy Irwin with the physical infrastructure of the college building designed by the famous architect Sir Walter George.

Lady Irwin College was founded in 1932, on the 11th day of the 11th month with 11 students from nine different regions across the country. As the first Home Science college of India established as was customary under the patronage of the then Vicereine, Lady Dorothy Irwin, the college is proud to have had illustrious founders including Annie Besant, Sarojini Naidu, Rajkumari Amrit Kaur, Kamaladevi Chattopadhyay, Sir Ganga Ram Kaula, Maharani Gwalior, Maharani Baroda and Margaret Cousins. The All India Women's Education Fund Association helped to lay a strong foundation for women's education till the college was transferred to the University of Delhi. The buildings designed by the renowned architect Sir Walter George are now classified and protected as heritage sites.

Lady Irwin College has pioneered women's education, investing scientific emphasis on home and community life. It is indeed a matter of pride that the Father of the Nation Mahatma Gandhi through correspondence with Rajkumari Amrit Kaur blessed the college with the motto ''विदा हि सेवा''. True to the motto, the educational endeavour is to inculcate a spirit of "knowledge to serve" through carefully planned classroom and outreach experiences. This spirit of service has percolated over the decades to put Home Science on the academic map of India. With facilities of residence the college continues to attract students from across the country and overseas.

Over more than eight and a half decades of its evolution, Lady Irwin College has actively been shaping Home Science curricula to include contemporary academic content, appropriate and innovative research and sound technological knowledge. The college has had the privilege of being recognized as a Centre for Advanced Studies by the UGC. In the University of Delhi, Lady Irwin College has the distinction of being the first college with postgraduate and doctoral courses of study. The undergraduate programme was introduced in 1950, followed in 1952 by the first postgraduate programme, and a Bachelor's degree in Education. With passage of time, undergraduate programmes in Home Science included both Pass and Honours courses under the aegis of the Faculty of Science, University of Delhi. Subsequently, postgraduate programmes have been initiated in each of the specializations of Home Science. At present there are five areas of specialization: Food and Nutrition, Human Development and Childhood Studies, Fabric and Apparel Science, Development Communication and Extension, and Resource Management and Design Application. A post graduate diploma in Dietetics and Health Nutrition and two Bachelors' degrees in Education, B.Ed. (Teaching subject Home Science) and B.Ed. Special Education (MR) are also offered.

The undergraduate and postgraduate curricula are reviewed and revised at regular intervals to reflect some of the advancements in processes of generation and comprehension of knowledge. The most recent revision enabled transition from the semester mode of learning to CBCS since July 2015 and Learning Outcome based Curriculum Framework (LOCF) in 2019.

The college has been a template for over 700 colleges and schools offering the discipline of Home Science in India and neighbouring countries, providing guidance in the development of curricula, programmes and infrastructure. Several important decisions of curriculum advancement,

research activities and educational principles have been initiated by the college. Several faculty members continue to support this input by active engagement with the Boards of Studies of several universities in the country, SCERT, NCERT and CBSE. The faculty of the college actively participates in consultations to government and nongovernmental organizations, national and international, such as the UN, regarding policy and planning for higher education in general, and the specializations of Home Science in particular. College participates in many programmes of the ministries of Health, Education, Women & Child and Renewable Energy.

Many of our highly qualified faculty have received national and international recognition for their teaching, research and publications. They lead and participate in research projects by institutions such as the UGC, the ICSSR, and designated government departments, national and international agencies.

An especially accurate marker of the success of an academic institution is its alumnae. Graduates of Lady Irwin College occupy executive positions in organizations such as the Planning Commission, UNICEF and World Bank. Many are in academia, including as deans of colleges, teachers and principals of schools. Numerous alumnae have been successful in the fields of art, fashion, literature and as entrepreneurs in a remarkable variety of businesses, in India and abroad. Significant to the college is the RAK Child Study Centre, a programme for young children and their families being successfully run by the college since 1955, exemplifying the transformative linkage between higher education and basic education.

The College is proud to have hosted eminent visitors including Mahatma Gandhi, Pt. Jawaharlal Nehru, Lord Mountbatten, Dr. Rajendra Prasad, Dr. Helen Keller, Queen Soraya, HRH Queen Elizabeth

The College is ideally situated in the cultural hub of Delhi. Art galleries, museums, exhibition grounds, theatre, music and dance facilities are accessible within a radius of a kilometre. It is well connected by the Metro. Recently, an additional building for post-graduate laboratories, ICT enabled lecture rooms and seminar facilities has been added. Laptops are issued to all students who feel the need to hone ICT skills and computer based learning. The new wing sustains the architectural and structured design of the heritage buildings.

Post Graduate Studies

In the year 2007, the college took a critical step forward in the academic programme by launching

updated curricula with more current nomenclature at the Masters level in all areas of study. All the five PG curricula were again revised in 2019 with contemporary content in LOCF format. The faculty of the Department of Home Science engaged with experts in the field and alumnae to accomplish this task. With the approval of the University, courses with revised nomenclature and contemporary content being taught in current session with renewed enthusiasm and application for



socially relevant study in each of the domains of Home Science.

Commitment to Community Work

The faculty and students have responsibly engaged with people and communities in diverse and difficult circumstances, fulfilling the role of the College in generating knowledge and enabling access to the public.

This has enriched and expanded the quality of academic work across specializations. Students receive the benefits of knowledge from advanced research activities even in their undergraduate years. Correspondingly, post-graduate and doctoral students are also urged to remain sensitive to needs of community, and align their studies with issues of the everyday lives of women, children, families, and social institutions, in the domains of health and nutrition, human development, community resources, classroom teaching or fabric sciences. Significant to this endeavour is the RAK Child Study Centre, a programme for young children and their families being successfully run by the college since 1955. It is this concern for and close contact with people that has been the hallmark of the college.

Advances in Teaching

Faculty members continue to advance their understanding of research in India by participating in orientation and refresher courses as required by the University of Delhi. Through these courses, conferences and seminars, the faculty keep themselves updated with the latest advances in their

respective fields. The college community is committed to higher education in Home Science through capacity building and empowerment of young women. In addition to developing core skills among the students, teachers

also address issues of gender, political participation, resource utilization, and ethics in research methods in each of the specializations. In this manner, the young women receive training for life skills as well.



Their experiences at college are arranged to facilitate self- development, as well as to develop them into active, energetic members of their community. Issues of social responsibility are integral to every course.

The college has a collaborative student exchange programme with the Michigan State University. Each year, students from both institutions travel, take courses and exchange ideas. This provides both the institutions and individuals with opportunities for healthy cross-cultural collaboration, academic exchange and cultural understanding. On both sides of the exchange, students return to their home country deeply enriched by the varied experiences that are arranged for them during their stay. Also, The Rural Youth Volunteers in India- HSU-LIC Twinning Programme (Supported by US Embassy in India) conceived in 2017 and executed in 2018, has created an opportunity for cultural exchange of young students selected through a rigorous procedure of selection conducted by Humboldt State University in Arcata, California (U.S.) and Lady Irwin faculty for their set of students. In 2020, due to COVID-19 pandemic, the teaching advanced significantly through online platforms. Even the University exams were in OBE (Open Book Exam) format. All UG and PG teaching and research were ICT enabled.

ALL INDIA WOMEN EDUCATION FUND ASSOCIATION (AIWEFA)

The All India Women's Education Fund Association (AIWEFA, estd. 1929) celebrated 92 years of service to the community. AIWEFA is the founding trust body of the Lady Irwin College, New Delhi which was established in 1932. Promoting holistic and sustainable development, AIWEFA activities include education and training of women for family and child care, environmental sustainability, health and nutrition, development of rural families through introduction of drudgery reducing equipment for agricultural management, women's skill development, women's political representation, and programmes to fight violence against women. Combining academic strength with sound implementation and training strategies, AIWEFA campaigns and mobilises through its field projects, seminars, workshops, publications and networking, to bring about a sustainable approach to human development and advancement of the weaker sections. In 2003, AIWEFA accepted the role of Regional Coordinator of the UN's Informal Regional Network of NGOs (NGO IRENE); in 1999,

AlWEFA was granted the "NGO in Special Consultative Status with the Economic and Social Council of the United Nations (ECOSOC)"; in 2017 Observer Status was granted by the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC).

An annual programme on AIWEFA's calendar is the AIWEFA - Nina Sibal Memorial Award - a Citation and Rs. 8 lakhs is presented to an awardee-organisation working in the disabilities sector. Due to COVID restrictions, at the online XVIII Nina Sibal Award function, the award was received by Mr. K. Nageswara Rao, Trustee and Chief Functionary Kasinadhuni Durgamba Butchaiah Trust, KDB Trust, Andhra Pradesh on 2nd August 2020 in recognition of the Trust's services in alleviating the difficulties of the differently abled children in rural areas.

In recent times, from 2016 AlWEFA has held presentations at the sessions of the Commission on Status of Women at the UN headquarters, New York on the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) to achieve the 2030 agenda for development. "A World We Women Want" captured sound SDG implementation strategies from Africa, Asia, and Asia Pacific and SAARC countries,





on women's economic empowerment in India. The "Khadi Goes Global" national and UN, New York campaigns created awareness of khadi spinning and weaving as a zero carbon employment opportunity for rural women in partnership with the Fashion Design Council of India, Ministry of Micro Small and Medium Enterprises, the Permanent Mission of India to the UN, New York and FICCI FLO.

The CSW64 was cancelled in 2020 due to the COVID-19. In 2021 AIWEFA co-hosted the virtual event "A World We Women Want: Gender-Just & Violence- Free" with India's Ambassador to the United Nations, on 18th March 2021. An AIWEFA film on the subject was sponsored by UNICEF and the speakers included UNICEF Executive Director, UN Women's Dy. Executive Director, Secretary Ministry of Women and Child Development and ambassadors to the UN from Ireland and Mexico.

AIWEFA held a national series of five webinars, "Covid 19, Community Connects" for different generations and senior citizens.

THE DEPARTMENTS

DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

The one-year Bachelor of Education Programme initiated in the year 1952 and the B.Ed. (Special Education) in 2007, as a part of the Faculty of Education of the University of Delhi. The B.Ed. Special Education programme is recognized by the Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI) and B.Ed. by NCTE, to strengthen the Home Science graduates and post graduates professionally.

The focus includes various facets: training in teaching skills, mastery of classroom management techniques, competence to handle children with special needs, ability to establish warm interpersonal relationship within the class, development of communication skills, reflective thinking skill, training in various Home Science and Science related work experience, sensitization to community needs, skill in construction and appraisal of various evaluation devices, and development of teaching learning materials. The close interaction between students and teachers and the participatory nature of the programme enables the students to gain confidence and self-reliance, encouraging students to manage their own affairs in a democratic ethos. The B.Ed. programme from 2015 is of two years.

The B.Ed. programme is for two years duration, since 2015. The programme helps to strengthen the Home Science graduates and post graduates professionally. A popular option for six decades, the programme maintains the spirit of preparing competent teachers.

The students/interns of the course find an easy placement in various schools and other allied institutions. They may be

- Recruited as PGT Home Science, TGT Science and Home Science, activity teachers, special educators and primary teachers in various private and state-run schools
- · Teach vocational subjects such as meal planning and fashion studies etc.
- · Work as counsellors in schools.
- Placed in institutions like Women's polytechnics, Nursery Teacher Training Institutions, DIETs, SCERT, NCERT, NUEPA and various NGO training and research organizations.



 Recruited as resource room teachers in schools and as special educators in institutions and schools.

Research Activities

 Students of B.Ed. first year and second year were involved in action -oriented research work throughout the academic session 2020-2021 with their tutorial group supervisors and School Experience Programme -II supervisors respectively. And also submitted their final report to their respective tutorial and school experience programme -II supervisors.

Value Added Course

- One week (30 hour) online value-added course on "Disaster Management" was organized in collaboration with Delhi State Bharat Scouts and Guides from 22nd March 2021- 26th March 2021.
- One week (30 hour) online value-added course on "Benefits of Yoga for Mental and Physical Health" was organized in collaboration with Jawahar Lal Nehru National Youth Centre on the occasion of "International Day of Yoga-2021" from 21st June 2021-26th June 2021.

Skill Enhancement Department Activities

Reflective Teaching Classroom Practices (2020-2021)

This workshop is specifically designed for second year students who have learnt/ given an exam in the Pedagogy of Science and Home Science courses in the first year and about to begin School Experience Programme (SEP) in the second year. This workshop enables them to reflect on their classroom experiences during SEP and also appreciate reflective practices.

Home Science/ Science Enrichment programme (2020-2021)

This programme focuses on the content of Home Science and Science which needs to be updated to enable the student teacher to teach "correct" content in the areas. This supports students understanding of current trends, life skills and planning, managing in execution of classroom activities efficiently.

- A webinar was organized on the topic 'Ethics in Science' by Prof.






- A debate on 'Science Vs Society' was organized among all students by making different focused groups and teachers coordinating the entire process on 19th February 2021.


during the session.

Internships

- Students of B.Ed. as a part of their School Experience Programme (SEP) were engaged and actively practiced online for a total of 20 weeks, i.e., two weeks in the first year and for 18 weeks in the second year as an essential part of their curriculum.
- Summer Internship was organized for B.Ed. First year students in NGO's as a part of the community outreach programme. The students have been involved with various NGO's viz. working in the area of health, education, social issues, education varying from Early Childhood Education, Adolescence Education, Education of Women and Children living in slums, education of children of craftsmen and several other areas.



- B.Ed. special education students also as a part of their School Experience Programme (SEP) were placed in 12 Special and Inclusive Schools for a total of 120 days as an essential part of their curriculum.
- Students of B.Ed. First year were placed for internship in different organizations as HDFC, Pune Ambience School Gurugram and Wellskool, Kirti Nagar with their group supervisors for 30 days. They submitted their final report and presented their reflections.

Activities of the Department

- To enhance students' practical skills and confidence as a science teacher in the classroom, 'Science kits' were developed with them in April-June 2021.
- An online group activity was organized on the theme 'Examining Interface between Home Science and Skill Development' to build in depth knowledge of each field vis. a vis. skill development and understand interlinkages across the fields in February 2021.
- An online group activity was organized to understand different aspects of Seminar Method in March 2021 on "Exploring Different Methods and Approaches in Home Science-Seminar Method".
- To enhance students' skill development capacity and relevance as Home science teachers in school teaching, 'Home Science kits' were prepared along with them in April-June 2021.

FOOD & NUTRITION AND FOOD TECHNOLOGY

The Department endeavours to achieve excellence in teaching and research for outreach to community, industry, and institutions to ensure promotive health for all.

The Department of Food and Nutrition was the first Postgraduate Department of Lady Irwin College. B.Sc. (Hons) Food Technology course was started in July 2017. Presently the Postgraduate Department offers one year Post Graduate Diploma in Dietetics and Public Health Nutrition (PGDDPHN), two-year M.Sc. degree in Food and Nutrition and Doctoral Programme in Food and Nutrition under the Department of Home Science, University of Delhi. Furthermore, the Master's degree programme

is offered in three areas of specialization namely, Clinical Nutrition. **Public** Health Nutrition and Food Science and Processing. Students find employment in hospitals, clinics, fitness centers, government and nongovernment organisations working in the development sector, the food industry, and academic and research institutes.



Research Activities

The Department is actively engaged in research in areas of Clinical Nutrition, Public Nutrition and Food Science. The research focus of the Department is on assessment of nutritional status, nutritional concerns, diet quality, food security, microbiological



quality and safety of food products, situational analysis of programs/schemes for nutrition, management and prevention of diet related disorders, sports nutrition, development of behaviour change communication strategies/tools, development of new food products and other innovations in the field of food science. Around 20 PhD scholars are registered under the supervision of Faculty of the Department.

Twenty-five Master's students were guided to take up independent research topics and they wrote a dissertation as part of their academic programme. They worked on diverse topics related to nutrigardens, diet diversity, factors influencing eating behavior, relation of perceived stress with dietary habits/food choices, infant and young child feeding practices, especially in the context of COVID-19.

B.Sc. Food Technology second and third year students also undertook research projects under the mentorship of faculty members. The key areas covered included green packaging, utilization of agro industrial waste, utilization of flowers for manufacture of food products such as rhododendron, edible films made from banana peels and walnut shells, processed food and beverage selection during COVID-19.



DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN DEVELOPMENT AND CHILDHOOD STUDIES

Established in 1970, the Department came into being as the Department of Child Development. Over the decades, while retaining this niche expertise, it evolved and broadened its focus to encompass the entire life-span hence the name Human Development and Childhood Studies.

The Department has been committed to providing a coherent framework for learning across the curriculum as well as encouraging faculty to retain unique teaching styles and interests. Classroom instruction, professional organisational linkages, community service, and supervised field experiences provide the knowledge and skills necessary for careers in Human Development. Extensive – and meaningful – use of IT provides students with a contemporary educational experience.

Research Activities

The research focus of the Department of Human Development and Childhood Studies is on developmental concerns, issues of everyday lives, influences of cultural contexts and diversity in human development and well-being. The research conducted by both Master's as well as Doctoral students helps builds knowledge in human development. The Master's students were guided to take up independent research and write a dissertation as part of their academic programme. The department encourages students to take issues that are related to the social and cultural contexts



of development and helps build theory into practice. In this academic year students took up topics in a range of settings serving individuals of all ages, as well as families. This year the research majorly focussed on mapping the impact of Covid 19 on different areas of our living. Few students studied the changing patterns of play behaviour in preschool years and also documented experiences of parents with young children on managing their learning at home. In the adolescence period, students researched trends in adolescent friendship, mapping their emotional experiences and also gathering their perspectives on the construct of happiness during this pandemic. Students also conducted research on describing the experiences of online schooling for school going children and their use of gadgets. Some studies focussed on young adults such as understanding the concepts of well-being and experiences of young women about it. Lifestyle changes among young adults during Covid-19 were also an area of research. The life span perspective was used as a basis for understanding the lives of vulnerable elderly during Covid 19 pandemic. The students used online tools and forums such as social media platforms to gather data as face-to-face interaction was restricted due to the pandemic.

Internships

Internship opportunities provide the essential work experience that helps students put their education into practice. Post Graduate students were engaged in their summer internships during June 1-June 30, 2021 at an NGO Azad India Foundation, Bihar. The students were engaged in creating content such as designing posters to spread awareness on salient social issues for a social media campaign. They also designed an online survey to investigate the impact of pandemic on teachers in Kishanganj, Bihar who works for the foundation's projects. They also helped in analysis of data using thematic analysis and prepared a report on it. The students gathered hands on experiences in designing and analysing a campaign.

The department conducted many workshops for students with people working directly in the field. The students learnt about programme planning, managing NGOs and the skill of monitoring & evaluation. They also learnt about creating rural sustainable livelihood solutions via crafts. The department continues to honour its commitment to making the lives of people with disability better by a range of workshops being conducted in this area. Our students picked up skills in inclusion and



classroom management of children with special needs. They also learnt about sensory integration as an intervention.

Department's Outreach (besides curricular activities)

The academic programme focusses on contextual and systemic frameworks to the study of development and relationship processes through research, teaching and application. The department through its project and researches reaches out to Indian communities. The students served the community in Kishanganj, Bihar by working with the teachers there. It was an enriching experience for the students as they worked under the guidance of the Azad India foundation. The process of working directly with the community using culturally appropriate tools helped both the community and the students. This engagement with the community continues in different projects such as one on creating a resource kit on responsive parenting for children from birth to 6 years, which is funded by UNICEF.

DEPARTMENT OF FABRIC AND APPAREL SCIENCE

Fabric and Apparel Science is poised to be a leading department offering its students an ideal combination of professionalism for textiles & apparel industry as well as academic excellence. Department is constantly working towards the mission of delivering quality education and generating promising professionals by combining their creative ability.

The postgraduate programme in Textiles and Clothing was initiated in the academic year 1987-88. It has evolved and developed over the past three decades, achieving high standards of academic excellence. The post graduate programme is suitably supported by requisite infrastructure, latest equipment, computer facilities and an extensive department library. The courses have been diversified and re-contextualized keeping pace with the latest developments in the textile and



garment industry. The revised post graduate curriculum with a change in nomenclature to 'Fabric and Apparel Science' was introduced in 2007. The semester system came into effect from July 2011, by offering four semesters during post-graduation. The programme has been planned with the following objectives:

- To inculcate a close awareness of current trends, new developments and technological changes in the field of Fabric and Apparel Science.
- To foster appreciation of the traditions and heritage of textiles of the past and draw inspiration for the present.
- To provide depth, scope and professional competence through formal and non-formal education programs for continued professional growth.
- To equip individuals with the knowledge and skills necessary for creative, managerial and technical careers as well as entrepreneurship in the field of textiles and apparel industry.

The new curriculum is a unique blend of technology and design. The revision of the curriculum has also resulted in widening of horizons with the inclusion of new areas like Home Textiles, Textile Documentation & Conservation, Quality Assurance, Fashion Marketing and Merchandising, Business of Fashion, etc. The courses are suitably supported by hands-on experience through practical and research.

Field visits, seminars, workshops, projects and computer applications are integral to the course. The focus is on a strong industrial input with six weeks internship in various organizations such as spinning, weaving, processing, dyeing and printing units in textiles industry, garment industry, research institutes, textile testing organizations, textile museums and NGOs working for the upliftment of traditional textile crafts.

The post-graduate programme prepares students for career opportunities in the areas of design, technology, academics as well as research. The alumnae of the department are placed in various organizations as designers, merchandisers, production coordinators and managers, executives,

entrepreneurs, faculty and researchers. Department enables the students to begin exploring their creativity by enhancing skills beyond the basic level to the level required to excel in the industry.

Research Activities

The Department of Fabric and Apparel Science is actively involved in conducting research activities in various allied fields like textile design and innovation, green technology for apparels, zero waste fashion, conservation and revival of traditional textile crafts, sustainable development and economic empowerment. The other significant areas of research include capacity building of artisans, women and person with disability, extraction of fibres and dyes from the waste, best buying practices, life cycle assessment, quality assurance, consumer awareness programmes, workplace safety and ethical issues, designing garments for people with special needs, development of sizing system for apparels, etc. Also, in the pandemic situation research activities never stopped. Along with doctoral research scholars, the department also encourages and guides its post graduate students to undertake one year dissertation project as a part of their academic programme to gain a vision into the research process.

Webinars/ Conferences/ Workshops/Training/ Special Lectures

The Department among various other initiatives for facilitation of cross-fertilization of ideas and thoughts, regularly organises visits/workshops/special lectures for igniting the research acumen of its brilliant and dynamic students, researchers and faculty members. Outbreak of COVID-19 and nationwide lockdown was a testing phase for all. In response to the Covid-19 Challenges, the department took a mitigating action to build up its academic resilience. Apart from conducting online classes, the faculty has made great contributions through organizing webinars, special lectures and e-workshops in an effort to increase the knowledge of students, researchers as well as to keep them updated about the recent trends in academia, research and industry. During the pandemic, department of Fabric and Apparel Science hosted a series of online events on topics covering environmental, craft, fashion, marketing, research, patents and design related areas. These events were conducted via Google meet as a virtual platform to connect with the students and other experts in this field.



DEPARTMENT OF DEVELOPMENT COMMUNICATION & EXTENSION

The Department was established in the year 1964 as Rural Community Extension under the aegis of the Ministry of Food and Agriculture, Government of India and was later taken over by the University of Delhi. The course was restructured and the nomenclature Development Communication and Extension came into being in 2007. The students are trained to be experts in understanding behavior change communication and developing media and methodologies for the same. The curriculum is designed to build theoretical and conceptual understanding about issues of Poverty and social equity; Gender Justice and empowerment; Climate Change and Sustainable development facing marginalized communities. Students develop skills in participatory methods, techniques of advocacy as well as training in methodologies for capacity building and skill development of different stakeholder groups.

One of the pillars of the department is its strong extension programme, which is built into every course at the PG level. Theoretical and practical training is provided to all the students. Over the years the department has evolved a multi-faceted extension programme, that helps provide experiential learning and holistic training to the DCE post graduates to address the larger issues facing people of different communities. Field experiences are provided to students in diverse ways which include- concurrent field work programme in urban and rural communities; month long placement in development organizations, Government departments and or corporate organizations. For undertaking its extension and concurrent activities the department collaborates with a number of agencies. Synergy of different organizations strengthens the community activities as well as provides a broad-based exposure to students to the agencies and issues involved in development.

Research Activities



In 2007 the Department was renamed 'Resource Management and Design Application' after the comprehensive curriculum revision. The Department of Science has been engaging highly qualified faculty from various disciplines: Botany, Biomedical Sciences, Chemistry, Environmental Science, Horticulture, Molecular Biology, Physics, Zoology etc. Department of Science has interdisciplinary approach, it is committed towards instilling rational thinking, creating scientific temper and decision making amongst undergraduates through basic and applied teaching in the streams of Botany, Chemistry, Environmental sciences, Physics and Zoology. The curriculum of the subjects trains the students in laws of natural sciences through supportive practical experiments and field visits. Our students hail from various educational backgrounds, many of them are not having sufficient preparatory training in sciences. This Coursework hence helps preparing a level playfield for all by the time they are ready to pass out and join their professional duties.

The curriculum of science also helps students in developing research skill in sciences to do research at Masters and Ph. D. level. Many students opt for B. Ed. and B. Ed. Special Education after finishing their under graduate programmes. Having a strong science base at undergraduate level, the students are able to efficiently teach science to school students after doing Bachelor of Education. The Science courses provide skill and build capacities in students to become leaders in their professional life.

The Department of Science prepares the students to have an analytical thinking, to be observant, to have a rationalistic approach, to value and conserve natural resources and to be sensitive towards



agrarian society. The department makes the students aware about eco-friendly farming and organic food. The department organizes various academic activities viz. lectures, plantations, conservation of environment activities, field visits, Eco Club activities, quizzes etc.

Research Activities

The Department of Science is committed to conduct research based activities for the benefit of the students and academia as whole. The activities include, interdisciplinary research covering varied dimensions from all the core subjects like physics, chemistry, botany, zoology and environmental

sciences. The faculty is guiding students working in different areas of research like studies of physicochemical properties of honey, vitamin C analysis etc. under the DBT star program. The other domains of research include studies on birds, urban ecosystems and food habitat sustainability, long-term population dynamics of water bird communities and climate change, macrofauna diversity in agricultural soil for sustainable production of food, availability of food commodities through urban agricultural practices and impact of polluted Yamuna water on the agricultural practices performed by the farming community. The faculty members have also worked on molecular docking and MD simulations of different drug molecules on different viruses. They have been involved in introducing students to scientific writing for research journals and encouraging them to write research papers.

Library

Lady Irwin College Library supports all undergraduate and postgraduate programmes offered by the college by providing and facilitating the use of relevant material. It encourages students, faculty, and research scholars to pursue higher value of knowledge, creativity and wisdom and empowers its users to be connected with literature published and electronically available in the field of Home Science and allied areas through networks.

MISSION

The mission of Lady Irwin College Library is to provide:

- State-of-the-art library and information services conducive for academic enrichment as well as social and personal development of students, faculty and staff of the college;
- · Providing resources printed and electronic for the courses offered by the college;
- Providing strong database for academics and research in the field of Home Science and allied areas;
- Online cyber linkage with worldwide national and international networks, universities and research institutions.

COLLECTION

Founded in the 1930's with a few gifted books the library today has with more than 57,000 documents which 2,900+ research works (M.Sc. Dissertations, Thesis and Reports) and around 8,000 bound back volumes of periodicals. It facilitates access to hundreds of databases, making it one of the best library in South Asia for Home science collection. The major areas of its collection are: Food and Nutrition, Human Development and Childhood Studies, Fabric and Apparel Science, Resource Management and Design Applications, Development Communication and



Extension, Food Technology, Dietetics, Education and Special Education. The other areas include Food Science, Human Growth and Personality Development, Children with Special Needs, Gender Studies, Woman Studies, Apparel Design, Fashion Designing, Communication, Management, Sociology, Psychology and Applied Science. Many rare and old editions of books related to these areas are also available in the library. Reports and recommendations of many important organizations like WHO, FAO, UNICEF, UNDP, Ministries are also housed in the library.

TECHNOLOGY

The library is housed in a separate building constructed in 1958, which has one and a half storey structure. In 2009-10 the library building was renovated with latest ICT requirements, keeping the



ACTIVITIES

- Library membership with circulation facilities was provided to under-graduate, postgraduate students, research scholars, faculty and nonteaching staff.
- During the year 2020-2021, a total of 22 documents (11 purchased books, 06 donated books and 05 thesis/dissertations) were added to the collection costing Rs. 59,743/-. A total of 71 journals costing Rs. 10,22,849/- were subscribed.
- For library maintenance and library automation, Rs. 29,266/- and Rs. 2,27,445/- were spent respectively.
- Various documents received from faculties and students were checked for plagiarism using the Urkund/Ouriginal software.
- Remote access to Delhi University E-resources and N-List were provided to faculty and scholars/ students.
- Journal articles were provided to faculties whenever any such request was received
- A webinar conducted by Springer and Delhi University Librarians Forum on 14 August 2020, titled "Transforming and repackaging library services during Covid 19 Pandemic" was attended by Professional Assistants, Ms. Vandana Goel and Ms. Neha Singhal.
- Webinars were also conducted by the library for the benefit of students. A webinar on the topic "Plagiarism: what is it and how to



- **avoid it?"** was organized by the library on 24^{th} September 2020 from 9:15 am 10:30 am via Google Meet. It was attended by more than 150 participants. Various aspects of plagiarism were covered with examples the types, the causes and how best to avoid it.
- Another webinar on the topic "Reference Management Tools" was organized by the library on 31st October 2020 (Saturday) from 1:00 pm - 2:30pm. It was attended by more than 70 participants. The concept and importance of referencing was discussed with examples of different reference styles.

Computer Resource Centre

The Computer Resource Centre (CRC) acts as a nodal facility that installs and manages all of the centrally available network, hardware and software resources of the college. The centre maintains two dedicated labs equipped with 126 desktops, 435 laptops & 3 servers. CRC offers technical assistance through its well trained and dedicated staff.

CRC provides and maintains 24×7 internet connectivity in college through the IT Hub as a part of the Delhi University Network with a total of 25 Access Points. CRC offers both wired and Wi-Fi connections on campus. Access to fast internet and seamless connectivity to all computers is ensured through fiber optic cables. Users are provided with an individual login ID and password for accessing secured network. This password can be used to log on to college computers and personal devices (duly configured for the purpose) across the college campus.



Students and faculty are regularly issued laptops for academic pursuits. All users have been provided an official email ID and password to access communication from College and University.

CRC assists college students, Ph.D. scholars, teaching and non-teaching staff in transacting coursework, research and projects. It provides printing, scanning, and projection and conferencing services. CRC supports college work related to admissions, examinations, purchases, report writing and maintaining equipment & records. The college website, EPABX telephone system, CCTV surveillance are all maintained by the CRC.

Hostel

'A home away from home' Lady Irwin College Hostel nests around 200 graduate and postgraduate students coming from different states of India and abroad. The hostel made of red-brick is housed in two building that stand tall and majestic. The main hostel *Hilla Faridoonji Hall* was inaugurated in 1934 and the PG Hostel was inaugurated by Mrs. Hilla Rustomji Faridoonji, President, All India Women's Education Fund Association (AIWEFA) in 1954.

The main UG hostel houses undergraduate students and the PG hostel accommodates largely post-graduate students and Ph.D. scholars. The sprawling lush green lawns in front of the buildings add splendour to the architectural beauty of the red-brick buildings. The eye-catching serpentine staircase and spacious galleries in front of the rooms characterize the main hostel building. The interiors and layout of the rooms in the two buildings are in harmony with nature and ensure sunlight and free circulation of air. The students enjoy walking and jogging, in the lush green campus. They avidly use the basketball court for jogging, playing, group activities and also study sessions.

The hostel is Wi-Fi enabled. The all-purpose common room, 'Travancore'- is also the television and entertainment room with LCD facility. It also serves as a party room during festivals and special occasions and a study room during examinations. The hostel provides all the students a safe and comfortable environment and is a Zero Ragging and a No-Smoking Zone.

In the year 2020-21 the hostel remained closed due to pandemic however around 36 students booked their hostel seats (excluding mess facility). Hostel was opened only for offline practical classes as per D.U guidelines from 15th September to 30th October 2021.

The Hostel is managed by the Hostel Committee which is constituted by the Staff Council of the College and executed by the Warden in consultation with the college Director. The Hostel Committee comprises of the College Director, The Teacher Warden and two



Faculty members nominated by the Staff Council.

Rajkumari Amrit Kaur Child Study Centre

The Rajkumari Amrit Kaur Child Study Centre has been an integral part of the Department of Human Development and Childhood Studies (HDCS), Lady Irwin College. In its symbiotic relationship with the department, it functions as a laboratory setting for students, while the department acts as a technical support to the Centre from time to time. Since its inception in 1955, it caters to the educational and developmental needs of children from birth to 12 years of age, including children with special needs. The Centre provides opportunities for hands-on experiences and exposure to a variety of activities through play-way method, making learning interesting and enjoyable at the same time. It is our constant effort to incorporate novel and age-appropriate activities for children to help them achieve their optimal potential and inculcate confidence, curiosity and a willingness to learn. There is an attempt to nurture the uniqueness of each child, and so, the classroom processes provide adequate and appropriate resources, guidance and support to them to learn at their own pace. Also, in line with the philosophy of inclusion, efforts are directed at mainstreaming of differently abled children, together with sensitization of the community towards their needs and rights. Learning is facilitated through interaction with peers and Individual Education Plans to provide child-specific inputs, as per need.

The Centre offers the following core programs:

- 1. Kilkari- The Toddler's Club (6months- 2 years)
- 2. Infant Care Centre/Crèche (6 months- 2 years)
- 3. Play Centre (2-3 years)
- 4. Nursery school (3-4 years)
- 5. Inclusive Education for Children with Special Needs (3-8 years)
- 6. After School Care (2-12 years)

- 7. SETU- Systematic Early Training Unit (Birth- 3 years)
- 8. Occupational and Speech therapy
- Remedial Education classes for Children with Special Needs (3- 12 years)
- 10. Extended therapy sessions for Children with Special Needs after school hours.

The centre also acts as a space for providing supervision to ECCE trainees from other educational institutions such as IGNOU and Mobile Crèches. However, in the times of COVID-19, the regular programmes at RAKCSC had to be stopped in March 2020, and children's online classes were initiated from June 1, 2020. Currently there are 3 children in the online inclusive program.



CHERISH Canteen

The College canteen is aptly named **CHERISH CANTEEN** with the motto 'Choose Healthy-Eat **Right-Inspire Others-Stay Healthy**'. It is housed in the Students Centre and serves healthy and fresh food at reasonable rates to the staff members and students of the college. The canteen provides snacks, lunch and beverages during college hours. The canteen operations are duly monitored by the canteen committee members to ensure high standards of hygiene and cleanliness.

The Canteen has both indoor and outdoor seating capacity. Adjoining the canteen is a green space that offers a clean and student-friendly hang out zone to spend time with friends over coffee and refreshments.

The canteen is frequented by faculty members, staff and students. The canteen offers lush green surroundings through potted plants on the sill and tables, hanging plant baskets and the surrounding trees and hedges. Moreover, big dustbins are kept in the entire canteen area and ensure hygiene. The canteen staff is provided with uniforms which includes Cherish Canteen T-shirts, aprons and head gears. The diversity of food available here satisfies the appetite of faculty and students coming from diverse cultures and is also a hub for healthy debates and interactions of teaching and learning.

In the year 2020-21 the canteen remained closed due to the pandemic as per guidelines from University of Delhi.

Further, all the details pertaining to the NAAC and NIRF are also published on the college website for the concerned stakeholders. During 2020, the COVID19 pandemic scenario, the website has provided detailed information on the class transactions, course objectives, course outline and faculty involved in teaching various courses. Information about the Computer Resource Centre, Rajkumari Amrit Kaur Child Study Center and Canteen, enables the students to utilize the facilities to the maximum.

Annual events of the departments are also listed on the college website. In addition to this, data base of researches conducted over the past ten years is also available for reference on the website. The alumnae section enables former students to register and be part of the Irwinite family and participate in college activities. The Student Zone highlights the admission criteria to undergraduate, postgraduate and Ph.D. programmes. The website offers an interface between the college students and society. The website also provides the interface for fee payment for the various courses like UG, PG and PhD. Hostel Fees is also collected through the College website. The website is continuously updated and maintained by the faculty and Computer Resource Centre staff.

Women Development Cell

Lady Irwin College, University of Delhi has a very active and vibrant WDC (Women's Development Cell) in a women's college. During the pandemic and online classes, WDC along with College mentorship programme was specially empathetic, alert and approachable to our students who could and did reach out to us through text messages and calls 24/7. Our students felt that the college continued to hold their hand (virtually), were always available and supported, counselled and motivated them.

Department of Education organized the National Conference on Learning (NCL 2021) through virtual mode on November 26, 2021. The theme of the conference was gender and education. The conference explored gender related issues and considered a broader vision of how investing in education could promote gender equality, gender equity as well as sensitivity and empathy. A tribute was given to Ms. Kamla Bhasin, an Indian feminist, activist, poet, author, and social scientist. The welcome address

was delivered by the Director of the College, Dr. Anupa Siddhu. The guest of honour of the inaugural session was, Prof. Poonam Agrawal, NCERT. She highlighted the increasing importance of inclusive education to cater the needs and requirements of every child. The keynote address was given by Prof. Asha Shukla, Vice Chancellor, Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Social Science University, Indore. She highlighted the varied differences between sex and gender. She discussed the intersectionality of gender stating the vulnerable condition of women from marginalized sections of society. The guest speaker of the inaugural session was Dr. Anuradha Krishnan, who is SOGIESC Trainer, i.e., sexual orientation, gender identity and expression, and sex characteristics who is also a dentist by profession. She shared her personal experience of being a transgender. The conference was engaging for a diverse audience of students, teachers, research scholars, academicians, teacher educators and professors and gave students an opportunity to interact, learn and get inspired. The event also had a media coverage.

Institutional Ethics Committee

The Institutional Ethics Committee of Lady Irwin College for the year 2020-2021 had Prof. Marwah as Chairperson and Dr. Vinita Bhargava as Member Secretary and 13 members. The Institutional Ethics Committee had a total of 4 meetings in the academic year between October 2020 and Dec 2020. Professor Marwah and the esteemed members of the committee undertook these meeting under the trying times of the Covid 2nd wave and tirelessly reviewed the proposals of 5 M.Sc depts. and 10 Ph.D's. The external members (7) were Dr. Amita Joseph, Dr. Sona Khan, Dr. Vijay Tankha, Ms. Bindu Dogra, Dr.Hrudananda Mallick, Dr. Naval Vikram and Dr.Peeyush Jain. The internal members (6) of the committee were Dr. Priti Joshi (HDCS), Dr. Sangeeta Goomer (FN), Dr. Sarita Anand (DCE), Dr. Meenakshi Mittal (RMDA), Dr. Ritu Mathur (FAS) and Dr. Renu Malaviya (Education).

The committee bid farewell to Prof. Marwah in an online meeting of the IEC on 17-07-2021. Prof Marwah had been a part of the committee since its inception and played a key role in the writing of the SOP for the IEC. Standard operating principles were written and amended 3 times with Prof. Marwah's inputs as well as other members. Issues such as role of Technical Review Board of each Department in screening the proposals for technical soundness and also classifying them according

to the categories of Exempt/Expedited/Full Review were delineated with the early committees. In the meeting of 11th September 2015 - Prof Marwah was nominated as the new Chairperson of the IEC. On 24th September 2015 at 3.00 pm the first meeting took place with Prof. I.S. Marwah chairing the meeting and his last meeting was on 5th Dec 2020. The entire committee came together in appreciating Prof. Marwah's commitment and sincerity to the screening of the proposals and giving detailed suggestions at every meeting. His balanced views and calm persona always made each meeting a pleasure to attend and a deep learning experience. Prof. Marwah handed over Charge as Chairperson to Dr. Peeyush Jain. Dr. Jain who has been a member on the committee since 2014.

Dr. Vinita Bhargava also handed over charge as member secretary to Dr. Ravinder Chaddha at the same meeting. Dr. Bhargava had been a representative of the Department of HDCS from 2014-2019. She took over as Member Secretary from Dr. Bhanumathi Sharma in 2019.


The year 2020 was a rollercoaster ride for everyone. This pandemic was filled with lots of hardships but it


