ROSHNI is set up to empower women collectives, and equip them to lead social action on food, nutrition, health, WASH (FNHW) and gender interventions. We seek to enable women to transform their own lives holistically, through health and social development. Housed at the Department of Development Communication and Extension at Lady Irwin College, New Delhi, the Centre serves as a technical and knowledge management support unit to DAY-NRLM. It works as a knowledge and capacity building hub for scaling-up DAY-NRLM's Dashasutra Strategy and its committed activities under the POSHAN Abhiyan 2018-2022. ROSHNI established to mainstream Nutrition Health and Gender Equity through MoU between college and Ministry of Rural Development with financial support from UNICEF and led by Prof. Anupa Siddhu and Prof. Sarita Anand has been engaged in the following activities during 2022-23:

- Integration of Gender Equity into DAY- NRLM programme in Chattisgarh through Parivar Chaupal. Capacity Building of Gender Point Persons and Cluster level Federations for rolling out. Recognised as a good practice by NRLM.

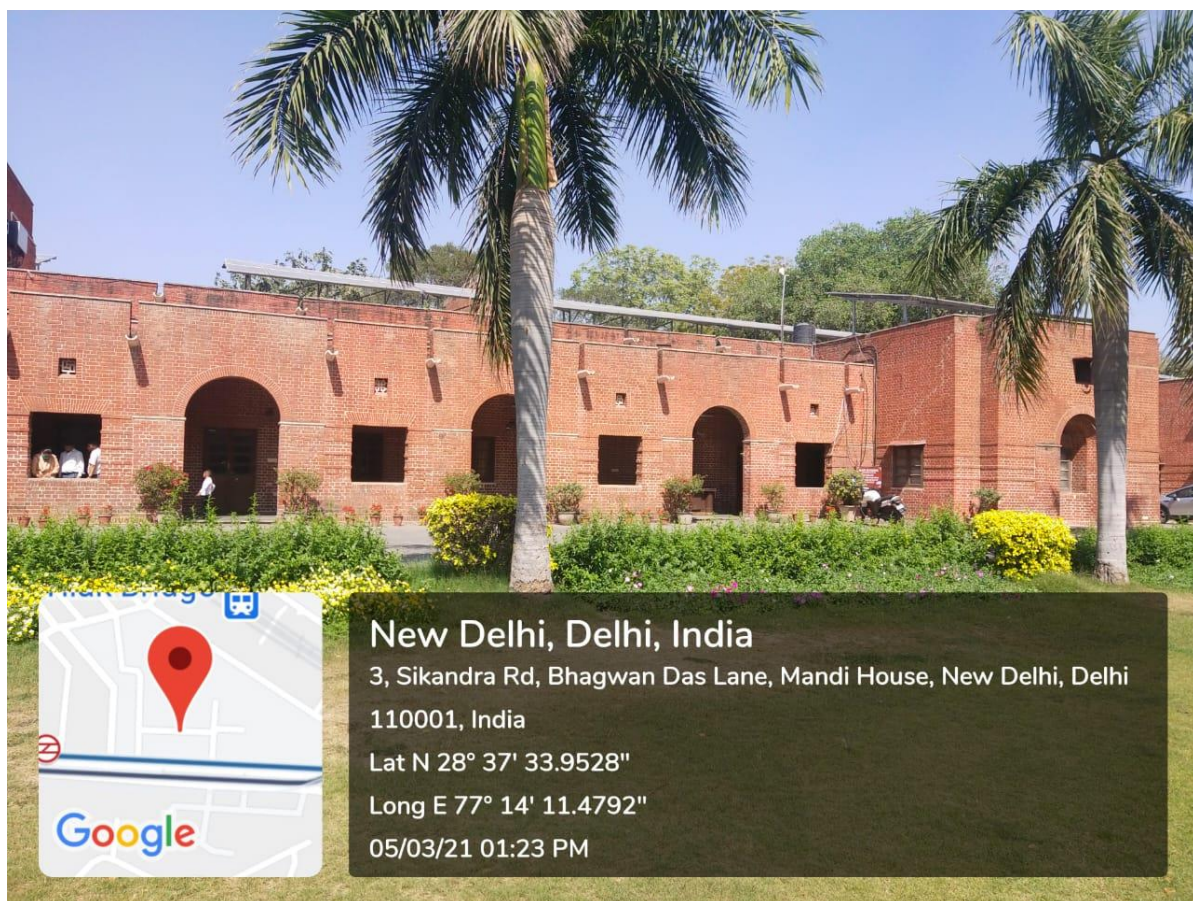




## **218 kWp Solar Power Plant at Lady Irwin College, inaugurated by Hon'ble Chief Minister, Govt. of NCT of Delhi on 14<sup>th</sup> October'2020**

Lady Irwin College is proud to have established a 218 kWp Solar Photovoltaic (SPV) rooftop plant on its premises, taking forward the Government of Delhi's RESCO model/scheme for solarization of government buildings. The founding members of the college have built a strong foundation based on core values of sustainability for achieving excellence in all spheres of life. Taking into consideration the effect of global warming, the college felt it was time to shift our dependency from fossil fuels to renewable sources of energy. The addition of this solar plant will not only fulfill our electricity needs but also help us reduce our electricity cost. The SPV plant has been installed and commissioned by M/s Oakridge Energy Pvt. Ltd. under the aegis of IPGCL, and has been net-metered by NDMC. The plant has been put up on three major buildings of college. The solar plant is generating about 3 lakh units of power each year and contributing greatly in Delhi's fight against pollution. The college has always been sustainable in its true sense and this project is going to take that legacy forward.

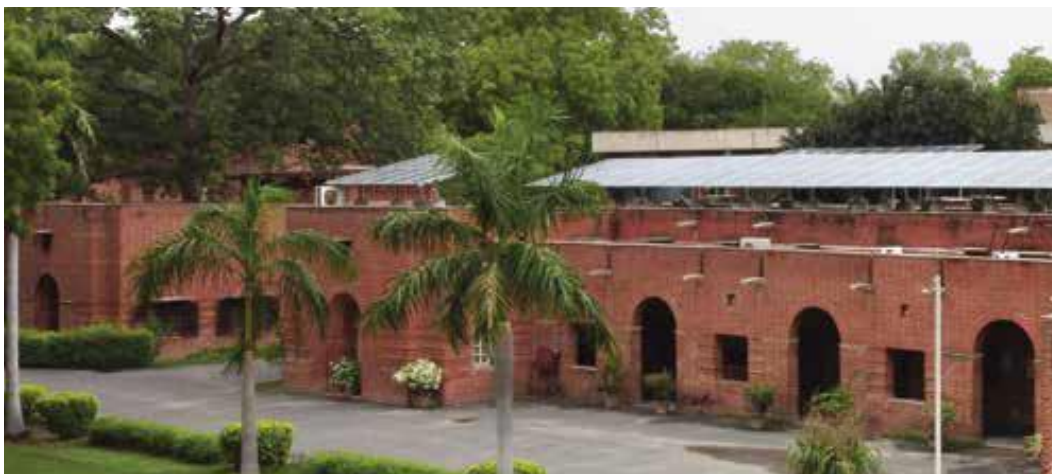

Under this initiative, the college has empowered beneficiaries towards supporting environment and imparted self-employment skills. This program aimed at training candidates for the job of a “Paper Bag Maker”, in the “Green Jobs” Sector/Industry. It aimed at building certain key competencies amongst the learner with reference to market analysis, preparing a business plan for marketing a paper bag, liaising with government authorities/local authorities, corporation etc. for smooth conduct of business operations, improving maker ship skills, setting up and managing paper bag manufacturing plant, managing human resources, ensuring health and safety at workplace, improving communication and soft skills including etiquette manner, perception etc., to name a few. Experiential learning was the focus of the training programme which was envisioned through blended pedagogies like demonstrations and visits. Moreover, self-exploration was encouraged among the trainees.

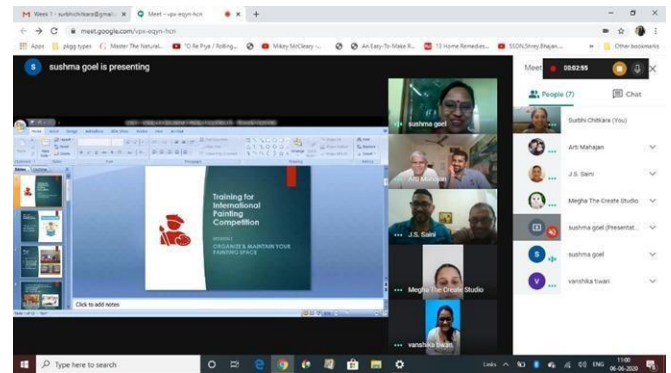

## **Centre for Communication for Social and Behaviour Change (CSBC)/ Human Centered Design (HCD), 2023 (With UNICEF)**

Support for Communication for Social and Behaviour Change (CSBC/SBC) curriculum rollout and adoption of Human Centered Design in India, by an MoU with UNICEF. The plan is to develop and work with the Department of Development Communication and Extension, Lady Irwin College as a technical Centre for applying HCD approaches in areas of child survival, growth and development. UNICEF will facilitate global resources for enhancing in-situ capacity on HCD. This joint action plan is being developed in collaboration with the UNICEF India team and the Department of Development Communication and Extension, Lady Irwin College for:

- a) Technical support and guidance to other Universities for the rollout of the modules on Social and Behaviour Change.
- b) Capacity development of various types of stakeholders from civil society organizations, government and other academic institutions on Behavioural Science including Human Centered Design and/or different aspects of the CSBC modules
- c) Conceptualize, guide and execute strategic communication<sup>1</sup>, training and capacity building, monitoring and evaluation, and research to support UNICEF's SBC programmes in health, nutrition, climate change, child protection, WASH, education or social protection. Develop capacities in use of participatory methodologies (including the Most Significant Change Technique) for developing feedback mechanisms amongst different stakeholders group.
- d) Provide support for research and evidence generation on drivers/enablers, programme innovations and implementation research especially related to understanding marginalized communities in driving social and behavioral change.
- e) Engage students and faculty in various activities of the Centre.

The UNICEF Social & Behaviour Change section will coordinate with the Department of DCE points of contact Prof. Archana Kumar and Prof. Aparna Khanna for the various Centre-related activities. The centre will promote students and faculty-led training, feedback, and evaluation initiatives for strengthening the programmes. The centre will function for a minimum period of

three years. The Centre offered technical inputs in a three-day regional workshop in Shillong, Meghalaya to integrate Social and Behavioural Change (SBC) curriculum into Higher Education Institutions in the North East and West Bengal.

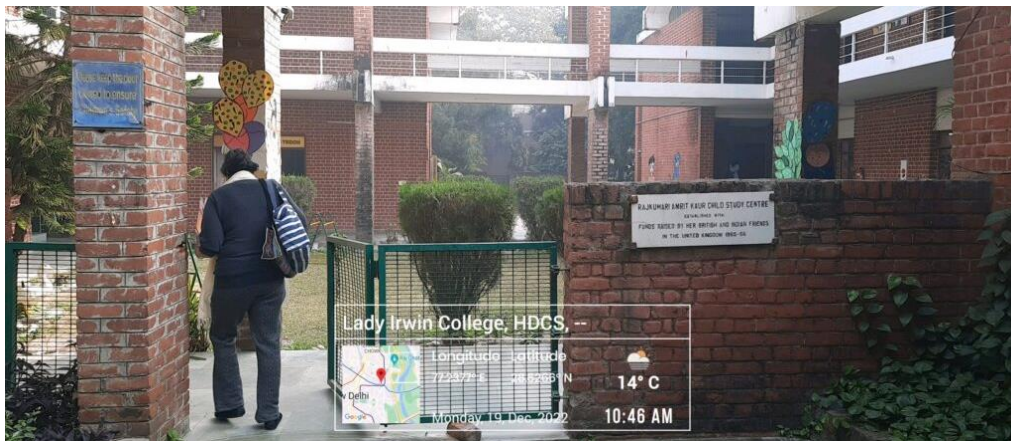

# MoU with Food Industry Capacity & Skill Initiative (FICSI)

## MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU) is made on 06<sup>th</sup> Day of August 2019 at New Delhi

### BETWEEN

**Lady Irwin College** having its campus at Sikandra Road, New Delhi-110001 (hereinafter called as "Lady Irwin College" which expression shall where the context so admits, include its successors, permitted assigns will include its constituents) of the ONE PART.

### AND

**Food Industry Capacity & Skill Initiative**, registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 having its office at 601, 6<sup>th</sup> floor, Mercantile House, Kasturba Gandhi Marg, Connaught Place, New Delhi – 110001, (hereinafter referred as "FICSI" which expression shall, unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof, be deemed to mean and include its successors and assigns) on the OTHER PART

Lady Irwin College and FICSI shall hereafter be collectively referred to as "Parties" and reference to "Party" shall mean FICSI or Lady Irwin College, as the case may be.

### WHEREAS:

The **Lady Irwin College**, New Delhi, located at Sikandra Road, New Delhi-110001 under Delhi University, The University strives to impart skill based quality education and promote research driven advancement of knowledge for creating successful professionals.

**Food Industry Capacity & Skill Initiative (FICSI)** is the Sector Skill Council for the "Food Processing" Sector and has been formed under the aegis of the National Skill Development Council (NSDC) and Federation of Chambers of Commerce of India (FICCI) as an initiative to promote skill development. FICSI is represented by Mr. Sunil K Marwah, its Chief Executive Officer. "FICSI" functions as an autonomous body and its main charter/objectives are as under:

- Identify the skill development needs of the "Food Processing" Industry.
- Set National Occupational Standards (NOS).
- Approve curriculum for training.
- Execute "Train the Trainer" programmes.
- Accredit Training Institutes imparting training in "Food Processing" related job roles.
- Set assessment and certification processes.
- Establish Labour Market Information System (LMIS).
- Undertake research to identify future needs.

This MOU is intended to outline the general framework for collaboration between the Parties for setting up a Skill Development Centre in Food Processing in various subsectors of food processing for creating trained manpower. The centre will also upskill the existing workforce and entrepreneurial capabilities in the State. The initial goal of this memorandum of understanding is to outline and describe certain of the respective goals, strategies and objectives, as the case may be, as well as the intent of the Parties to conduct collaborative activities to establish and promote a mutually beneficial relationship. As such, the

actual details of each specific collaboration and/or transaction will be determined by mutual agreement of Parties.

**BOTH PARTIES** mutually agree to conduct the following activities:

**A. Skill Development Centre**

Lady Irwin College has existing training infrastructure in Food Processing. FICSI will recognize Lady Irwin College as Training Provider. FICSI would extend all possible support to run the training programs on the QPs developed by FICSI and approved by NSDA. Lady Irwin College will conduct fee based training program for students of Lady Irwin College and training program for industry partner and corporates, entrepreneurs and Govt funded/Non- Govt. funded program (PMKVY/Non-PMKVY).

**B. Assessment & Certification**

FICSI will conduct Assessment of trainees trained under different skill based training programs of Lady Irwin College aligned to FICSI QPs. FICSI will also provide certificate to successfully passed candidates. Assessment fee will be charged by FICSI.

**C. Train the Trainer**

FICSI would organize Training of Trainers (ToT) programme for the trainers of Lady Irwin College in the premise of the college on the QPs developed by FICSI and approved by NSDA in collaboration with Lady Irwin College. Lady Irwin College shall not have any objection for including other trainers of FICSI in the ToT Program subject to fulfillment of pre-set eligibility criteria.

**D. Development of Occupational Standards, Curriculum & Learning materials**

FICSI is involved in the development of National Occupational standards, Qualification Packs, Curriculum & Course Content for the various segments of Food Processing. Lady Irwin College may support FICSI in development of higher level and newer QPs as envisaged in their program in terms of the technical knowhow, validations and other as per the requirement.

**E. Manpower & Infrastructure required**

The existing infrastructure and manpower of the Parties will be used for the implementation of the collaborative activities to the extent agreed by each Party. Within 30 days both parties will nominate a Liaison Officer for coordinating the collaborative activities with FICSI.

**F. Placement Support & Apprenticeship Program**

FICSI will provide placement support to students trained under FICSI developed Qualification Pack and FICSI will provide support to student for connecting with Industry based apprenticeship program.

**G. Special Projects**

FICSI will partner with Lady Irwin College for special skilling initiatives including upskilling of microenterprises under Special Projects

**H. Setting Up of a Co-ordination Committee**

The Liaison Officer from Lady Irwin College and Nodal Officer from FICSI will coordinate training, placement and internship.



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**I. Onboarding of SMART**

To actively participate in Skill India Program as a Vocational Training Provider Lady Irwin need to be affiliated in SMART NSDC Portal. FICSI will provide necessary support towards onboarding Lady Irwin College in SMART Portal.

**J. Branding**

Lady Irwin College and FICSI both will be responsible for driving external visibility of this partnership though and not limited to launch of event. Joint Lady Irwin-FICSI Press release (if required subject to the required clearance from the competent Authorities/Bodies from the either sides), promotion in website & Social media.

**K. Duration of MoU**

This memorandum of understanding shall be deemed to have come into force w.e.f the date of signing and shall remain in force for 3 years.

**L. Entire agreement**

This MoU shall constitute of the entire understanding between the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersede all prior agreements or understandings of the Parties relating thereto.

**M. Amendments**

No modifications or amendments of any terms or conditions of this understanding shall be effective unless made in writing and signed by the authorized representatives of the parties.

**N. Arbitration / Dispute Settlement**

In case of any dispute that may arise during or after project execution, the matter would be settled mutually.

**O. Notices**

All notices required or permitted by, or made pursuant to this MoU shall be in writing and sent by registered post to the following address:

For **Lady Irwin College** :

**P. Implementation**

The parties shall review the Implementation and the application of this MoU through a joint committee in every 3 months alternatively in New Delhi which will be notified later. This Implementation Committee shall meet as required at either of parties work places.

**Q. Assignment**

This MoU is based on the professional competence and expertise of each party and hence neither party shall transfer or assign this MoU or rights or obligations arising hereunder, either wholly or in part, to any third party.

#### **R. General Provisions**

Either party reserves the right to terminate this MoU subject to 60 days prior written notice to the other party hereto. Any program or activity that was already commenced shall survive the termination of this MoU and be completed to the best of both parties abilities pursuant and subject to the terms of this MoU.

#### **S. Non – exclusivity**

The relationship of the parties under this MoU shall be non – exclusive and both parties are free to pursue other agreement or collaboration of any kind. However, when entering into a particular research agreement which may have some elements of existing FICSI – Lady Irwin College collaboration, then the participants may agree limit each party's right to the collaborate with other on that subject.

This MoU has been executed in two originals, one of which has been retained by Lady Irwin College and other by FICSI.


