The Annual Alumnae Meet of the Lady Irwin College Alumnae Association (LICAA) was held on February 8, 2025, bringing together alumnae, faculty, and students to celebrate the spirit of the institution and its accomplished graduates.

A highlight of the evening was the presentation of the Distinguished Alumna Award for the year 2024 to Mrs. Seema Wadhawan Jerath, an eminent alumna from the

undergraduate batch of 1986. Mrs. Jerath, currently serving as the Principal of DLF Public School, Sahibabad, has made significant contributions to the field of education. She has authored over 30 books for parents, teachers, and children, developed innovative educational play materials, and held leadership positions with the CBSE, the British Council, and the National Progressive Schools Conference (NPSC). Her

exemplary work has earned her several prestigious accolades, including the National Award to Teachers (2012), the Lok Mani Lal Lifetime Achievement Award for Excellence in Education (2013), and the School Leadership Award (2017) presented by Mr. N.R. Narayana Murthy.

The event also featured a felicitation ceremony for retired faculty members Prof. Sushma Goel and Prof. Anupa Siddhu, acknowledging their invaluable contributions to the field of Home Science and to the college community.

In addition, a welcome party was organized to induct the outgoing batch of students into LICAA, marking the beginning of their lifelong association with their alma mater.

The meet was a memorable occasion, marked by inspiring stories, heartfelt tributes, and a strong sense of pride and belonging among the alumnae.
